On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther posted his 95 theses to the Wittenberg Door in Germany in which he listed the things that he disagreed with the Catholic Church. The posting of the 95 theses was start of the Protestant Reformation.

The story of Martin Luther demonstrates how one person can make a difference. One current example of how Martin Luther’s life continues to make a difference is through the lives of Civil Rights Leaders Martin Luther King Jr. and his father Martin Luther King Sr.
