Are You Wearing the Right Glasses? I thought it was interesting yesterday when Tomi Tanaka shared during the fellowship time that she went out for a walk and had a difficult time seeing until she realized that she had put on Joann's eyeglasses by mistake.

I realized I needed glasses 25 years ago when I kept missing the exit signs on the freeway. Without the correct lenses, objects are blurred and we may have a difficult time reading. But if we look through the glasses which the professional optician has prescribed for us, we can see everything clearly.

The same is true in our lives – the glasses we look through will determine how we see things. How we see things will affect how we feel, and how we behave or react in certain circumstances. Wearing the wrong glasses may mean that we focus on the problems we can see, rather than focusing on God, who's able to work in these problems for good.

Thought For Today: Are you wearing the right glasses? If we're going to see things as God sees them, we need to wear the glasses He's prescribed for us – **lenses of faith and trust**, so that even if we can't see the whole picture we can have clarity of vision to know God is in control of our lives.
