Pastor Joe's Message



Do you believe in the resurrection of Jesus Christ a historical fact or a made-up story?

Easter is around the corner. What comes to mind first when you think

of Easter? Is it the Easter Bunny? Or perhaps spring break and vacations for the kids?

For us Christians, the resurrection of Jesus Christ should be the first thing that springs to mind.

Are you a Christian? Being a Christian means you believe in Jesus. But believing in Jesus means believing in His resurrection.

If someone claims to believe in Jesus, His teachings, and His crucifixion but not His resurrection, then strictly speaking, they can't truly be considered a believer in Jesus. Romans 10:9 says, "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." In other words, salvation comes to those who believe in Jesus' resurrection, not just His teachings or His sacrifice on the cross.

So, we need to be sure: Is the resurrection of Jesus Christ a historical fact or just a made-up story?

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is a historical fact, and here's why:

First, the resurrection fulfilled prophecies. Apostle Paul pointed out to the Corinthians, who doubted the resurrection, "If it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead?" (1 Corinthians 15:12). Jesus' resurrection was not an accident or a fable, but the fulfillment of prophecies made hundreds of years before His birth, as seen in Psalms 16:10 and prophesied in Isaiah 25:8, 26:19, Daniel 12:13, and Hosea 13:14. Jesus Himself predicted His resurrection at least fifteen times.

Second, there were numerous eyewitnesses to His resurrection. It wasn't done in secret but was witnessed by many. 1 Corinthians 15:5-8 lists these appearances, including to Peter, the Twelve, over 500 followers at one time, James, all the apostles, and lastly, to Paul himself. The transformation of doubters and persecutors, like James (Jesus' brother who became a believer

after Jesus' resurrection) and Paul (formerly Saul, a persecutor of Christians who became an apostle after encountering the risen Jesus), underscores the reality of the resurrection. These witnesses' testimony, along with their willingness to die for their belief, strongly supports the truth of the resurrection.

Furthermore, non-Christian sources mention Jesus and His followers. Josephus, a Jewish historian, wrote, "Jesus, a wise man, performed surprising deeds and was a teacher of people who accepted the truth gladly. He won over many Jews and Greeks. He was the Messiah. When Pilate, upon hearing him accused by men of the highest standing among us, had condemned him to be crucified, those who had in the first place come to love him did not give up their affection for him. On the third day he appeared to them restored to life."

Tacitus, a Roman historian, acknowledged, "Christus, from whom the name had its origin, suffered the extreme penalty during the reign of Tiberius at the hands of one of our procurators, Pontius Pilatus, and a most mischievous superstition, thus checked for the moment, again broke out not only in Judaea, the first source of the evil, but even in Rome."

Ignatius, an early Christian martyr, confirmed, "Jesus Christ was truly persecuted under Pontius Pilate, was crucified and died, and truly rose from the dead. Those who believe in His resurrection will also be resurrected."

These testimonies, alongside the willingness of early Christians to die for their belief in Jesus' resurrection, underscore its historical reality. Therefore, you're encouraged to firmly believe in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The risen Jesus is alive today, ready to come to those who call on His name, listening to their prayers and conversations.

Let's remember this Easter that the resurrection of Jesus is not just a story but a transformative truth that offers us hope and salvation.

Prayer Card Writing Instructions

1. Reflect Before Writing Your Prayer Requests

- Purpose of Prayer Answers: Receiving an answer to your prayer serves a
 dual purpose. Firstly, it brings glory to God. Secondly, it allows the person
 who prayed to experience the living presence of the Lord.
- **Specificity in Prayer:** The more specific your prayer, the more specific the answer you may receive. Vague prayers might result in uncertain answers.
- Tangible Prayer Requests: Have tangible prayer requests. For example, instead of abstract requests like "Please fill me with the Holy Spirit" or "Let my faith grow," opt for specific ones like "I want to pray 20 minutes a day 5 days a week to grow my faith. Please help me," or "Help me find the determination and support to quit smoking this year to deepen my relationship with God."

2. Set Goals in Two Main Areas for Your Prayer Requests

- **Spiritual Aspects:** These are prayer requests about your relationship with God. For example, "Grant me the ability and wisdom to read the New Testament in its entirety in the year 2024", "Send a passionate believer of the Christ to our father in Japan."
- **Physical Aspects:** Pray for matters such as physical health, acquiring a new home, children's education, marriage, promotion, business expansion, or financial stability.

3. Share Your Answered Prayers

After you receive an answer to your prayers, please inform the pastor who interceded for you. Share your testimony. Testifying about what Jesus has done is a way to glorify God.
