PROFILE OF A DISCIPLE

- 1) A Disciple has accepted Jesus Christ as his/her personal Savior and Lord. (John 1:12, Romans 10:9-11)
- 2) A Disciple is a learner who is open and teachable. He/She is eager to learn from God and others, and is committed to seeing God transform his/her life into the image of Christ. (Romans 12:2; Philippians 3:13-14; Psalm 119:33-37)
- 3) A Disciple loves God with all his/her heart and soul, resulting in a relationship of supreme and incomparable love for Jesus Christ. This love is demonstrated by submission to Christ as Lord in ALL areas of life. (Matthew 22:37-40; John 14:21)
- 4) A Disciple has a continuous involvement in the Bible and demonstrates a desire to learn and apply God's Word. He/She regularly hears, reads, studies, memorizes, and meditates on it; his/her life is increasingly saturated in the scriptures and marked by the scriptures. (2 Timothy 3:16-17; Joshua 1:8; Psalm 119:9, 11)
- 5) A Disciple has a daily devotional time with God and is developing in his/her prayer life, which includes adoration, confession, thanksgiving, and supplication. (Philippians 4:6-7; Joshua 1:8)
- 6) A Disciple attends church <u>regularly</u> to worship God, to be ministered to and to serve through his/her gifts and abilities in order to enrich the lives of others. A Disciple is also committed to seeking other opportunities for building supportive relationships with believers in Christ. (Hebrews 10:24-25; I Corinthians 12:7; I Peter 4:10)
- 7) A Disciple has a growing heart for the lost, can give his/her testimony clearly, and faithfully shares the Gospel with others as God gives opportunity. Romans 1:16; I Timothy 2:3-6)

- 8) A Disciple is involved in the process of spiritual reproduction through investing his/her life in others. (Matthew 28:19-20; 2 Timothy 2:1)
- 9) A Disciple is committed to living a holy life, increasingly demonstrating the fruit of the Spirit in his/her words, actions, and relationships. A Disciple is willing to take steps to separate from sin. (Galatians 5:22; I Peter 1:15-16; 2 Timothy 2:22-26)
- 10) Disciple is available to be used God whenever, wherever, and however He chooses. A Disciple follows Christ at personal sacrifice, assuming responsibility gladly. (Luke 9:23; 2 Timothy 2:3-10)
- 11)A Disciple demonstrates faithfulness in whatever God and others have entrusted to him/her. He/She is a good steward of his/her body, time, talents, finances, and possessions, always seeking to honor God in these areas. (I Timothy 4:14-16; I Peter 4:10; Matthew 25:14-30; I Corinthians 4:1-2)
- 12) A Disciple demonstrates a servant's heart by denying himself/herself to serve others in practical tangible ways. (Mark 9:35; Matthew 18:4, Luke 22:25-27)
