III. Unpacking the Passage: The Exaltation of Christ

The Exhortation To Unity:

1] **If** you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, **if** any comfort from his love, **if** any fellowship with the Spirit, **if** any tenderness and compassion, 2] then make my joy complete by being **like-minded**, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose.

The Exhortation To Be Like-Minded:

3] **Do nothing** out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but **in humility consider others better than yourselves.** 4] Each of you should **look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of** <u>others</u>. Philippians 2:1-4

The Example of Christ:

5] **Your attitude** should be the same as that of Christ Jesus:

6] Who, being in **very nature**^[a] God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, 7] **but made himself nothing,** taking the very nature^[b] of a servant, being made in human likeness. 8] And being found in appearance as a man, **he humbled himself** and became obedient to death—**even death on a cross**! 9] Therefore God <u>**exalted**</u> him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, 10] that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11] and every tongue confess that <u>Jesus Christ</u> <u>is Lord</u>, to the glory of God the Father.
