"The angels said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here: he has risen, just as he said." Matthew 28:5-6

On Sunday we celebrated the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. But why did Jesus come to earth? We love the celebration of Christmas but we also remember that from the time that Jesus was born he was born to die. Matthew 28:5-6 tells us that on the first Easter morning, the women who came to the tomb were in for the surprise of their lives. Instead of finding a closed tomb, they found an open grave, and an angel greeting them with the words, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified.
