“Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God.” Romans 15:1

Then the judge said, “I’m not a religious person, can you share with me a little about what a pastor does?” So I explained to him a few things that I am responsible for. Then he asked, “do you have any religious convictions that might interfere with serving on jury duty. I told the judge, the attorney’s and all the prospective jurors in the courtroom, “The bible says in Romans 15, that as Christians we are to **submit ourselves to the governing authorities.** Therefore, your honor I see serving as my civic duty and I will serve to the best of my ability. On the other side your honor, I am extremely busy.”

When I got home I told Sherry that God had given me an opportunity to talk about God and the bible to the judge, attorney’s and other jurors that may not know Christ. I could tell by the response in the courtroom that some other Christians were glad that I shared my faith.
